GENERAL INFORMATION

ENG 1300 is 6 credits of free electives

ENG 1430: 3 credits fulfill the GE Composition requirement; the remaining 3 credits counts as free electives.

Free Electives: At least 50% of Free Electives must be at 3000-4000 level. English majors may not use ENG major courses as Free Electives except for ENG 1996 and ENG 3291/2/3. Free Electives can be used to complete a minor (generally 18-24 credits) or a second major in another discipline. Summer Courses: Kean offers two summer sessions each year. Students may take two courses (or seven credits, whichever is greater) in each summer session. Summer courses are recommended as a way to stay on track for four year graduation if fewer credits than recommended are completed during regular semesters.
